

THIRD MISSION: WIE KÖNNEN WISSENSCHAFTLER*INNEN GESELLSCHAFTLICHE VERANTWORTUNG LEBEN? – NOTWENDIGKEITEN, KONZEPTE UND UMSETZUNG DER “DRITTEN MISSION”

Univ.-Prof. Dipl.-Psych. Dr. Barbara Schober

Wir leben in einer Zeit wachsender sozialer, wirtschaftlicher und gesamtgesellschaftlicher Herausforderungen. Hochschulen (und Wissenschaft generell) sind zunehmend gefordert, aktiv und gezielt zur Gestaltung von Gesellschaft beizutragen, sich in die Lösung von Problemen einzubringen. Warum braucht es dafür ein neues Konzept? Wie werden Erkenntnisse nutzbar für die Gesellschaft? Welche systematischen Umsetzungen der „dritten Mission“ gibt es? Wo sind Herausforderungen, Grenzen und Entwicklungs-perspektiven? Wie können Universitäten die diesbezüglichen Erwartungen und Bedürfnisse von Gesellschaft und Wirtschaft gezielt aufgreifen? Was bedeutet das für individuelle Wissenschaftler*innen und v.a. für junge Wissenschaftler*innen?



Ausgehend von einem Einführungsvortrag sollen im Workshop zunächst solche grundlegenden Fragen diskutiert werden, bevor wir in Kleingruppen versuchen zu erarbeiten, was das „Leben der dritten Mission“ im Kontext der je eigenen Forschung und Lehre bedeuten kann. Ziel des Workshops ist es, mit dem Konzept vertrauter zu werden, es zu reflektieren und in seiner persönlichen Relevanz zu konkretisieren.

OPEN SCIENCE AND PREREGISTRATION

Dr. rer. nat. Hilmar Brohmer, M.Sc.

The ability to meaningfully preregister one's future studies and experiments is a key skill for young researchers along with other Open-Science related skills (such as Open Data and Open Materials). A preregistration consists of (precise) hypotheses, description of study designs and variables, a justification for a sample size, and an analysis plan. These components along with caveats will be discussed in this workshop. Additionally, different forms of preregistrations will be shown and attendees will be introduced to the concept of registered reports. In the hands-on part, attendees will be shown how to create a project site on an online repository that supports study preregistration (i.e., the Open Science Framework).




There are no prerequisites, but attendees should bring a laptop. Ideally, attendees are currently in a study planning phase, which might be useful when they start writing a preregistration.



SOCIAL EVENING MAIN CONFERENCE | 04.09.2022 | 19:45
